



Getting Started Stormwater Management Planning

Based on your needs and/or permit requirements, TJCOG will develop a stormwater management plan (SWMP) to satisfy all six Minimum Control Measures (MCMs), as well as any jurisdiction-specific challenges you may face. In addition, TJCOG will create any model ordinances necessary to meet these requirements.

Public Education and Outreach

1

Distribute educational material and outreach activities to inform the public about how their activities impact water quality and stormwater runoff.

Public Participation and Involvement

2

Engage all economic and ethnic groups, and provide opportunities for participation in stormwater programming.

Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)

3

Develop a plan to detect and eliminate illicit discharges to the stormwater system, including outreach materials and an IDDE reporting system. If needed, TJCOG will inventory and map all stormwater assets.

Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Controls

4

Develop and conduct weekly monitoring for an erosion and sediment control program for construction activities that disturb one or more acres of land.

Post-Construction Site Runoff Controls

5

Develop a program for and conduct weekly monitoring of post-construction stormwater runoff from new development and redevelopment areas

Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping

6

Develop a program to prevent or reduce pollutant runoff from municipal operations. Provide comprehensive training to municipal staff on pollution prevention measures and techniques.
